Students opt in to Music at the end of year 8 (for year 9) and do Music instead of 1 of their Games lessons per week. They choose again if they want to continue Music as a GCSE option as they do for their other subjects.

Triple Science is an option in Year 9. This is currently an accelerated academic pathway. In addition to the 4 hours of teaching in the Science Curriculum, students receive an additional 3 periods of time. Within that time the student will have 2 periods extra of Science, and 1 hour of Maths to drive towards the highest GCSE standard in both subjects.

Lifeskills is taught in a dedicated period for year 7, 8 and 9. In year 10 and 11 it is taught in form time.

Extra English and Extra Maths is an option at the end of Year 9 for students who require additional help in either of those subjects.

Ethics is taught on rotation with Games in year 10 and will roll into year 11 next year.
